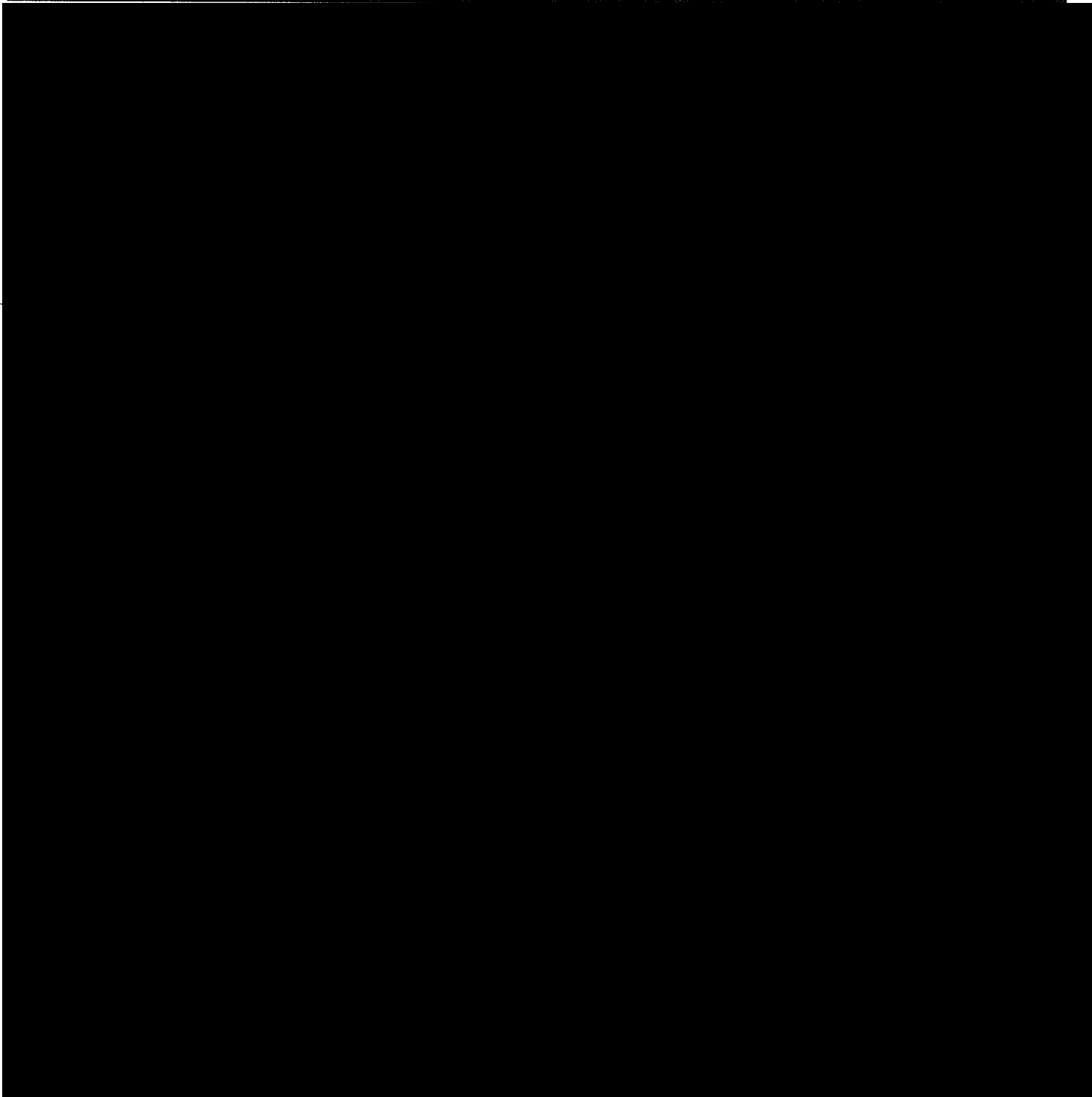


Narrative



Master Bedroom

The master bedroom was located at the northeast corner of the house and was furnished with typical bedroom furnishings including a king size bed, a dresser, and nightstands. The bedroom entry door was located near the west end of the south wall and opened inward into the room. There was an alarm system control panel mounted to the wall on the east side of the entry door. To the east of the entry door was a walk-in closet. The closet door, which opened outward from the closet, was open. This is the closet in which the decedent was located and will be described later in this supplement.

Narrative

At the southwest corner of the bedroom was a nightstand. The nightstand's drawers were partially open and on top of the nightstand were a drinking glass and a picture frame. Lying on the floor near the nightstand was a picture frame, several prescription pill bottles, and other miscellaneous items. Along the west wall were two window units inset within a window seat. On top of the window seat were books, household decorations, a blanket, and a make-shift antenna. In front of the window seat was an electronic treadmill. Draped across the treadmill's handle was a white robe and lying on the treadmill base was a laundry basket, and a glass.

At the west end of the north wall was a set of double doors leading to the master bathroom. The doors, which opened inward into the bedroom, were open. Lying on the floor in front of the doors was a pair of blue underwear.

To the east of the bathroom doors, against the north wall, was a dresser. Most of the dresser drawers were partially open. On top of the dresser were, among other items, perfume bottles, decorations, medication bottles, a wooden jewelry box, and various types of containers. The lid to the jewelry box was lying on the bed. There were several socks on the floor in front of the dresser.

The headboard of the bed was centrally located along the east wall and the bed extended outward to the west with the footboard at the center of the room. There were nightstands on each side of the bed and single window units behind each nightstand. There were numerous items lying on top of the bed including several pieces of jewelry, jewelry boxes, a "Galaxy S" cell phone, a black purse, a wallet, a make-up pouch, a debit card in the name of Jaime Melgar, two "Los Cucos" restaurant receipts (**item #3**) dated "12/22/2012 8:59 PM", miscellaneous cards and papers, and a Texas Drive License in the name of Sandra Melgar (inside wallet). There was a black jacket draped over the northwest bedpost and two pairs of jeans and a sweater lying across the footboard. At the southeast corner of the bed was a black zippered pouch that was lying under a pillow. The pouch, which was open, contained several sexual novelty items.

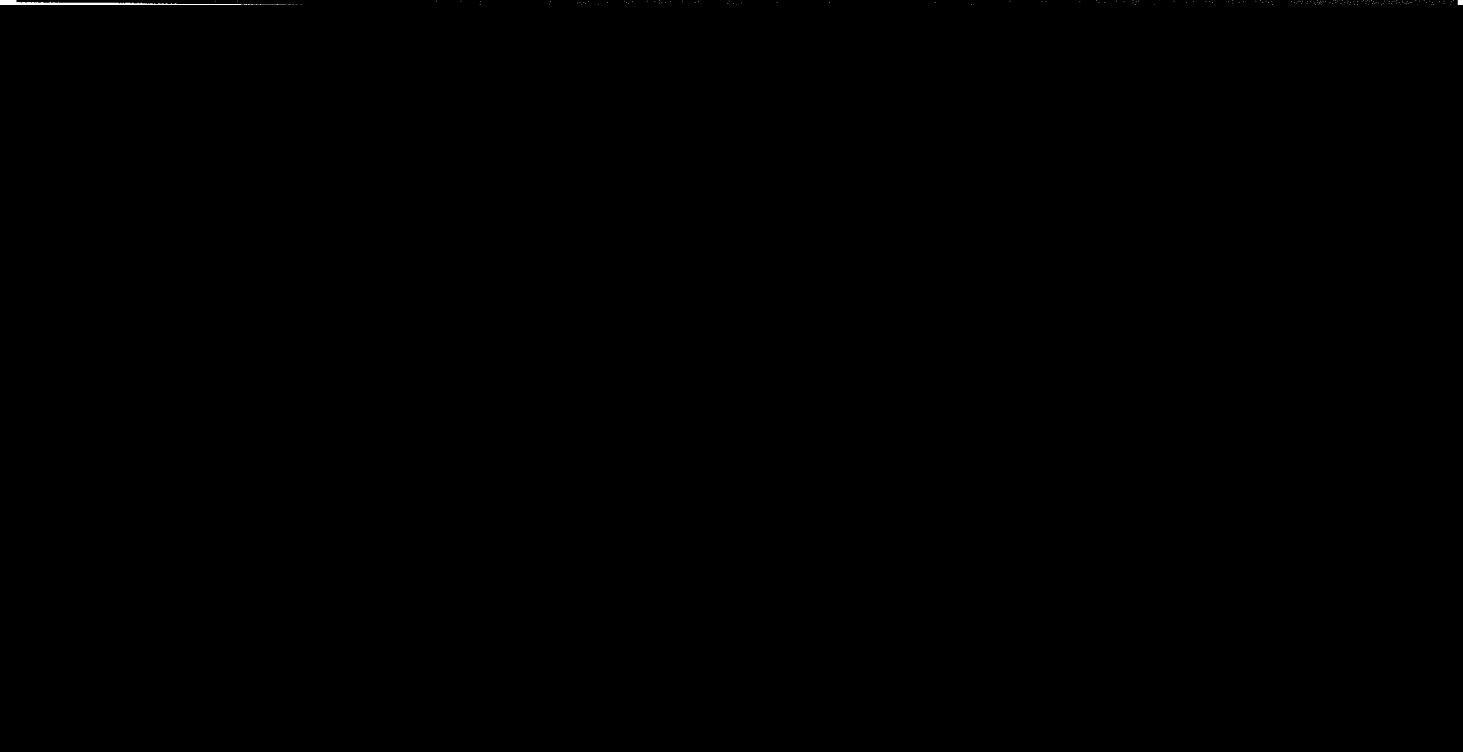
On top of the north nightstand was a lamp that was turned on, a wooden box containing various products, a drink bottle, a silver case, and a single white pill stamped "ASPIRIN" lying on top of a coaster. On top of the south nightstand was a lamp that was off, a hard wired telephone, a cordless telephone, miscellaneous papers, eyeglasses, books, sets of keys and a candle which was lit. The south nightstand drawers were slightly open. There was a pillow, standing on end, on the floor between the nightstand and the open closet door. There was a blue sweatshirt and a black house shoe on the floor between the nightstand and the bed.

Master Bathroom

The master bathroom was located to the north of the master bedroom and at the northeast corner of the house. The lights in the bathroom were on. At the northwest corner of the room was a large whirlpool bathtub. There were large, opaque, fixed windows on the north and west walls behind the bathtub. The bathtub was filled with, what appeared to be, water. Lying at the bottom of the bathtub was a large kitchen knife (**item #11**), a white blouse (**item #12**), a green towel (**item #13**), and a white towel (**item #14**). The knife had a black handle and a single edged, pointed tipped blade which was stamped "Calphalon 6" Chef Knife". The knife, which was of the same style as the knife found in the kitchen drawer, had an overall length of 11 ½ inches. The blade was 6 inches in length and 1 5/8 inches wide at the hilt. There was a reddish-brown colored substance on the blade and handle, in the area of the blade's hilt. Swabs were taken from the blade and handle of the knife. There were numerous items on the rim of the bathtub and both window sills including, household decorations, bath products, towels, a 1.75 liter bottle of "Tito's" brand vodka, a 2 liter bottle of "Coca-Cola", a plastic bowl containing uneaten strawberries, and a bowl of whipped cream. There was one uneaten strawberry in the whipped cream. Lying on the floor next to the bathtub were bath towels, a light blue colored robe, a white t-shirt, a pair of white colored briefs, and a piece of a multi-colored scarf (**item #19**) that was tied in a knot.

Along the west wall, south of the bathtub, was a vanity with a single sink. Lying on top of the vanity were numerous personal grooming products and there was a black brazier in the sink. At the north end of the vanity was a jewelry case, which was open, and several open jewelry boxes (**item #15**). The vanity's drawer was slightly open. On the floor in front of the west vanity was a space heater and a brown "CVS" paper bag (**item #16**).

Along the north wall, east of the bathtub, was a vanity with a single sink. Lying on top of the vanity were personal grooming products, a pair of orange colored handled scissors, a 1.25 liter bottle of "Sprite", the lid to the container of whipped cream, and an empty plastic "Dole" strawberries container.

Just in front of the north vanity was a chair that was covered with a fabric covering (**item #17**, chair cover). The back of the chair was against the north vanity. There was a small reddish colored stain on the corner of the seat area of the cover. Lying on the floor near the north vanity and just behind the chair was a piece of a multi-colored scarf (**item #21**) and one piece of a purple colored cord (**item #22**).

At the southeast corner of the bathroom was a shower. Inside the shower were bathing products, a spray bottle of

cleanser, and a squeegee. The shower enclosure and floor were dry. To the north of the shower was the door to a walk-in closet and at the northeast corner of the bathroom was the door to a small toilet room. Inside the trash can in the toilet room was a plastic glove (**item #25**).

There were three pillow shams on the bathroom floor that appeared to have been used as bath floor mats. One was located just outside the shower door, one was located just outside of the closet (**item #18**, pillow sham), and one was located in front of the toilet. All three of the shams were bunched up. The pillow sham near the closet door was torn on one of its sides. There were two pieces of purple colored cord (**item #20**) lying on top of the pillow sham. There was one piece of purple colored cord (**item #23**) and one piece of a multi-colored scarf (**item #24**) near the closet door.

The closet door was equipped with a standard entry knob with no lock. The interior of the closet measured 7 feet 11 inches north/south and 6 feet 8 inches east/west at its widest point. Inside the closet were hanging clothes and ~~clothing and other personal items on shelves and on the floor.~~ To the north of the closet door was a chest-of-drawers. On top of the chest were, among other items, a shoe box, several belts, and two wooden cases. The top two drawers of the chest were open. There were numerous items piled on the floor in front of the chest including shoes, bags, and boxes. There was an alarm system control box mounted to the wall above the closet door. The box was closed and there were no observable signs of tampering.
